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


But, before we look at the food – which was excellent in all regards – please allow me to showcase just what an adorable restaurant Chinese Dynasty is.

Check this out - this is not a painting... it's a window!





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


In fact, Chinese Dynasty stands tall in one of Dubai's most prized locations – deep in the historical district Bur Dubai, hosted by the impressive Arabian Courtyard Hotel and Spa.

This is one of Dubai's heritage 4-star hotels with a historical Arabian theme, located opposite the Dubai Museum and surrounded by points of interest such as the Meena Bazaar, Gold Souk, Spice Market, Al Fahidi historical area (Bastakiya), Al Seef Dubai Creek and within walking distance to the diplomatic enclave – basically, the heart of old original Dubai!

You enter, and it looks like this:






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
You are reminded of this incredible location on the terrace of Chinese Dynasty as well - here is the view!

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And all served with kind and generous Thai hospitality





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


And there were more!
