






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In fact, every evening, right after sunset, families and friends congregate to end the day's fasting together – and it is a time of connection and sharing food.



It is usually cooked in large quantity, as the preparations are quite laborious, often starting early in the morning and lasting all day. The result is a super-tender, melt-in-your-mouth slow-cooked lamb, which has both absorbed from and contributed to the flavorsome aromatic rice.

At Mowsem, you will find several of these special dishes each evening throughout Ramadan, and the main *piece de resistance* is rotated so there's always something new and different for honored guest to try.




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Actually, Mowsem's is huge!






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And both the indoor and outdoor sections are excellent choices.






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Outdoors there is the live grilling station, with a proper clay oven as well as open charcoal grills,



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




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
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

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Elegantly displayed, the desserts are arranged by type - and of course I had to start with the Arabian sweets!





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
